

Conjunctions are words we use to join sentences. The **conjunctions and**, **but** and **or** are used to join sentences.



- I like chocolate cake and I ate a big slice.
- I like chocolate cake **but** I was too full to eat any.

I sometimes like chocolate cake or I sometimes like fruit.

Two other useful conjunctions are **so** and **because**.
