Student Book eBooks	A digital version of each of the six Student Books. The Student Book eBooks include everything you need to deliver the course to your students, guide their activities and assess their progress. These can be assigned to students to use at home. These enhanced eBooks contain presenting and whiteboard tools so that they can be used in class to support teacher-led learning. They also include hotspots to animations, interactive in-book questions and key word audio.	✓	
Workbook eBooks	A digital version of each of the six Practice Books. Every activity in the Student Book is supported by an associated activity in the Workbook. The activities can be used as homework or as additional practice exercises to supplement class work. These enhanced eBooks contain whiteboard tools so that students can add their own answers. They can be assigned to students to use at home.	✓	
Teacher Guide eBooks	A digital version of each of the six Teacher Guides. Each Teacher Guide includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An introduction with advice about delivering science and using the Student Books and Workbooks. • A brief lesson plan for every lesson in each Student Book and Workbook. • Model answers to the activities and investigations; and answers to the assessment activities. 	✓

<p>Interactive In-book Questions</p> 	<p>There are four interactive in-book questions for each unit of the course.</p> <p>The interactive in-book questions are individual formative assessment questions that address common misconceptions or key ideas in the unit. These interactive questions are marked automatically and a score is given, but the scores are not recorded in the Reporting area of Oxford Owl. Once a score is given, the individual marks can be viewed by pressing the 'Questions' button on the score screen.</p>		<p>✓ (Unit pages)</p>
<p>Key word audio</p> 	<p>Important scientific vocabulary can be found in Key Words boxes throughout the Student Book eBooks, along with their audio to further support language learning.</p>		<p>✓ (Key Words boxes)</p>

<p>End of Unit Interactive Quizzes</p>	<p>One per unit (to be used at the end).</p> <p>Each Interactive Quiz contains summative questions that cover the learning objectives for the unit, in the order they are covered in the unit. The Interactive Quizzes are marked automatically and an overall score is given. Once a score is given, individual marks can be viewed by pressing the 'Questions' button on the score screen. Each time an Interactive Quiz is completed, a student's mark is recorded in the Reporting area of Oxford Owl. Students can complete quizzes multiple times, and multiple scores will be recorded. These can be completed as a whole class, or independently at home.</p>	<p>✓</p>
